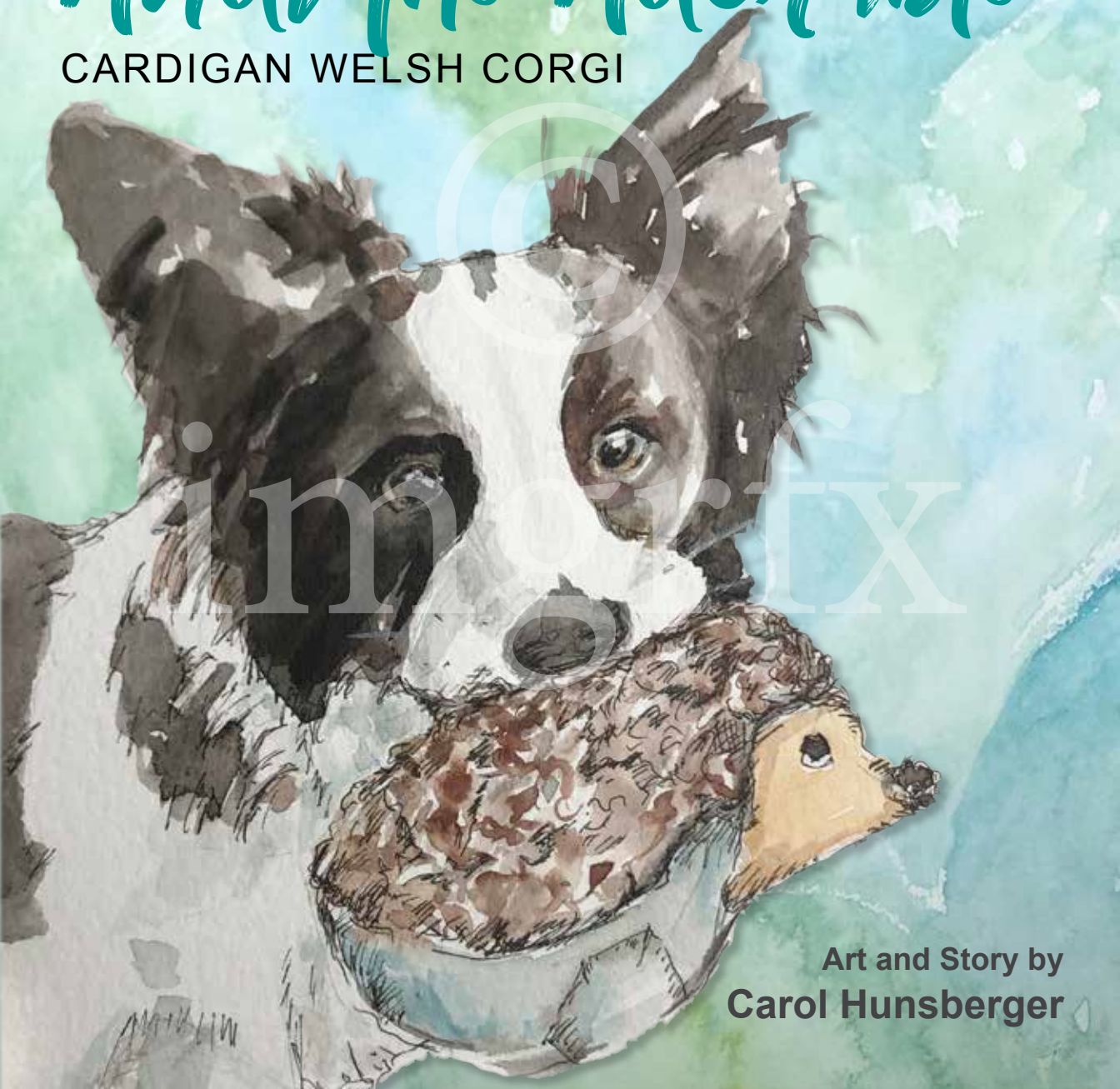

Andi loves to find and smell things...

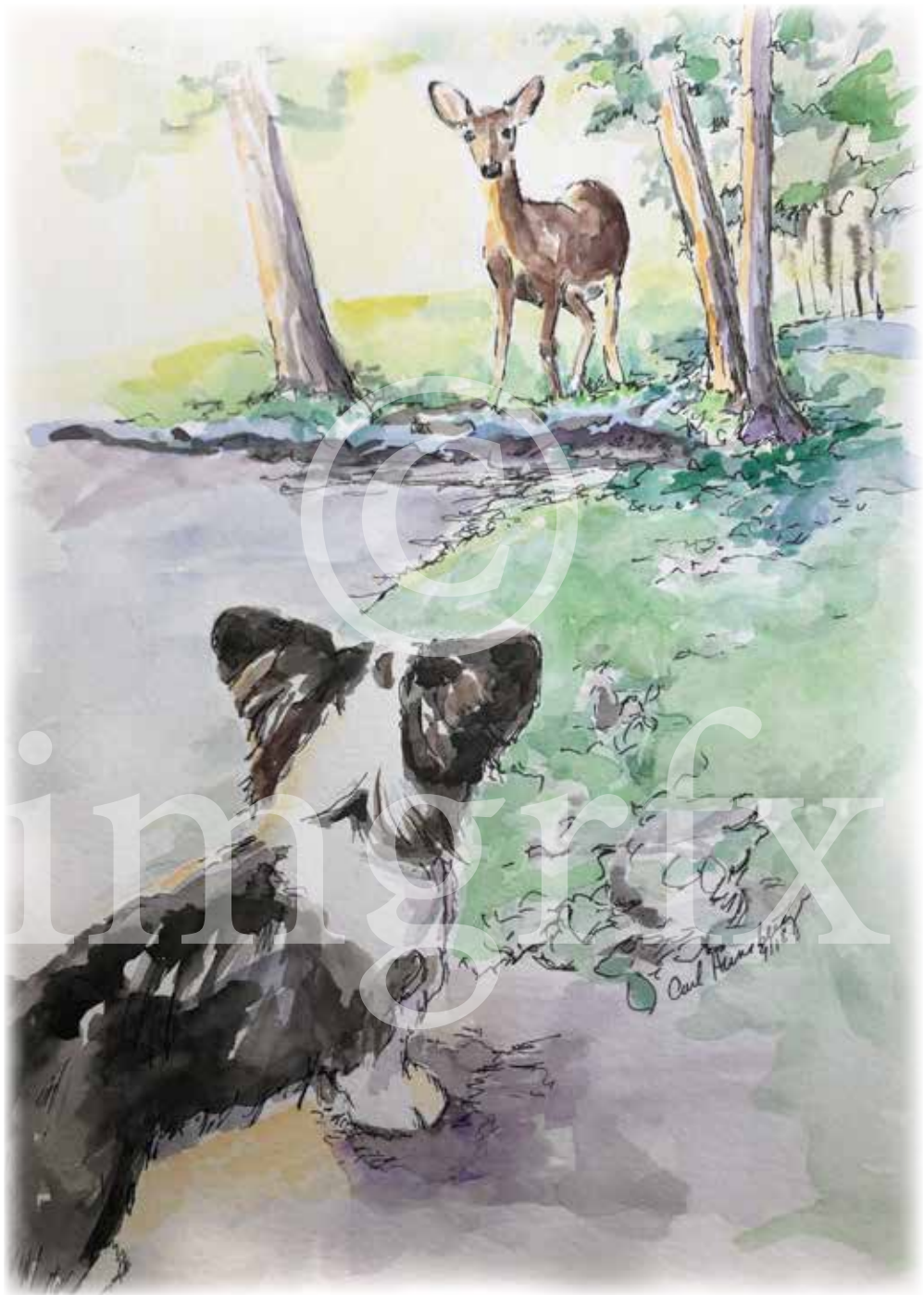


... and sometimes she eats them.
